#### About CoAPCR

The Consortium of Academic Programs in Clinical Research is a network of academic programs, industry partners, and individuals committed to the development of high-quality educational programs encompassing all areas of clinical research that are based in academic credit-granting institutions



#### CoAPCR Mission



To provide a medium for communication among educators of clinical research professionals.



To encourage and support the development, accreditation, and maintenance of academically based clinical research educational programs to meet the needs of the clinical research community and enterprise.



To foster inter-institutional articulation among educational institutions, clinical institutions, professional associations, government, regulatory agencies, and industry.



To initiate and/or support research and studies relating to the educational, manpower and service needs of clinical research professionals.



To develop organizational and policy positions to be communicated to various agencies and associations, including lay public and media.



To monitor legislation and policy regarding clinical research issues and insure professional representation and voice on these matters

#### CoAPCR History

- By the early 2000s, there were over 30 institutions with academic programs in clinical research
- Discussions of common issues took place during professional meetings, most notably at DIA annual meeting
- A core group was formed and continued these discussions throughout 2001 and into 2002
- At the 2002 DIA Annual Meeting in Chicago a DIA Special Interest Area Community, Academic Clinical Research Education, was formed. In addition, a nonprofit was established called the Consortium of Academic Programs in Clinical Research (CoAPCR).



#### CoAPCR Milestones

**2003**: CoAPCR began with support from DIA, CenterWatch, and 6 founding academic programs Initial mission was to develop a process for accreditation.

**2009-11**: Development of Core Competencies for clinical research graduates

2012-13: Established pathway to accreditation of clinical research programs through the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs.

Committee on Accreditation of Academic Programs in Clinical Research was formed.

**2013-16**: Collaborated to develop the Joint Task Force for Clinical Research Competency and the Core Competency Framework




**2018**: First academic program receives accreditation (Arizona State University)

Ongoing: Publication of original research and other articles related to clinical research education

- Collaboration between programs establishes a network for sharing best practices and promoting quality in education














#### • Regular (Institutional) Membership


- Post-secondary academically based educational institution or clinical facility accredited by a regional institutional accrediting agency that is recognized by the US Department of Education located in the USA or for institutions abroad recognized by either the US Department of Education or by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation, offering certificate, diploma, or degree programs for clinical research professionals.
- o Multiple members per institution, 1 voting member. \$250 annual membership fee.

#### . Sponsoring (Supporting) Membership

- Stakeholders of CoAPCR that wish to contribute annually to the financial support of COAPCR at a higher level. Membership allows for the suggestion of individuals to be considered for representation on the <u>CAAPCR</u> (ie, committee on accreditation).
- Multiple members per organization, no voting rights. \$1000 annual membership fee per organization.

#### • Sustaining Membership

- Any individual who wishes to contribute annually to the support of CoAPCR.
- o Individual member, no voting rights. \$100 annual membership fee.
